INTERNATIONAL STUDENT
TWELVE-MONTH BUDGET**

Credit and Non-Credit Courses

Effective Fall 2014

In order to be accepted as an International Student and receive a Form I-20 from Baltimore City Community College, a student must provide financial documentation that reflects the sponsor's financial ability to accept this financial burden **for the entire length of the student's program**. Financial documents must be presented in the **original** (no scanned or faxed copies, please) and be **no older than 3 months** at the time of submission. All financial documents must be in English or officially translated to English. Bank statements must show at least **3 months of transactions**, showing at least the minimum balance below at the end of each month. The names on the bank statements must match the names on the Financial Support Statement, or Form I-134. That financial burden is estimated as follows:

Degree or Certificate programs

❖ TUITION AND FEES (\$2,875 per semester for 12 credits)	\$5,750.00
❖ LIVING EXPENSES	\$6,229.00
❖ OTHER (Transportation, Books, Supplies, etc.)	\$2,867.00
TOTAL YEARLY ESTIMATED LIVING EXPENSES*	\$14,846.00
Minimum balance required on financial support documents (2 years of expenses)	\$29,692.00

English Language Instruction (English as a Second Language)

❖ TUITION AND FEES (up to \$1,860 for 18 hours/week)	\$3,720.00
❖ LIVING EXPENSES	\$6,229.00
❖ OTHER (Transportation, Books, Supplies, etc.)	\$2,867.00
TOTAL YEARLY ESTIMATED LIVING EXPENSES*	\$12,816.00
Minimum balance required on financial support documents (18 months of expenses)	\$19,224.00

- *Students who need a Form I-20 for dependents:* Please provide financial documentation with an additional \$2, 000.00 for each dependent (spouses and children who will remain in the USA with the student).
- In order to maintain F-1 visa status, students **MUST be enrolled full-time** (at least 12 credits enrollment each semester for credit programs or at least 18 hours/week enrollment in the English Language Instruction classes).
- Tuition may increase with normal inflation.
