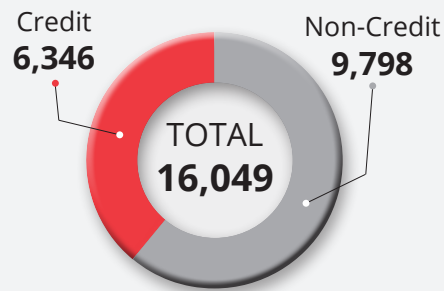

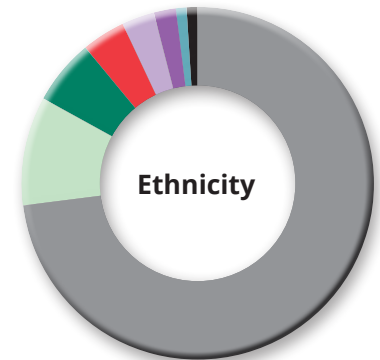

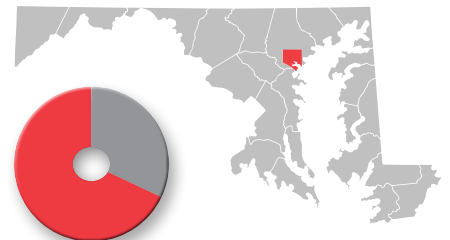

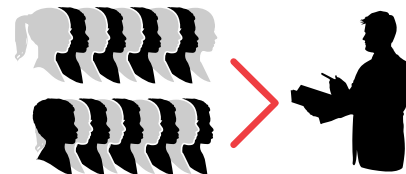

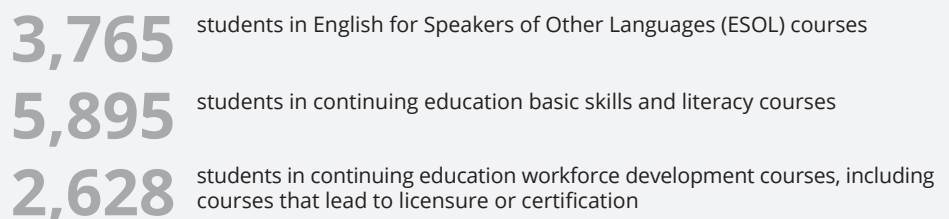


## STUDENT-TO-FACULTY RATIO

## TUITION & FEES PER SEMESTER

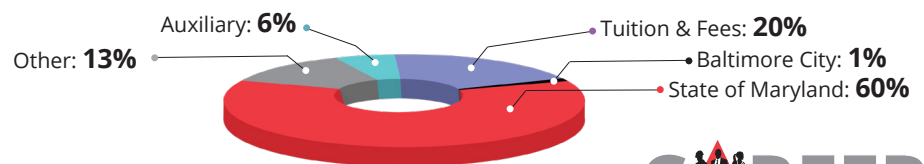
After 12 hours of payment of tuition and fees, in-state and out-of-state students will be allowed up to 6 hours with no additional cost in tuition and fees.
