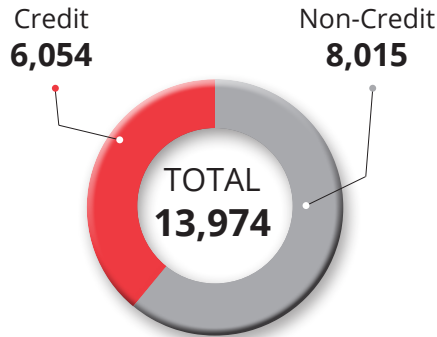

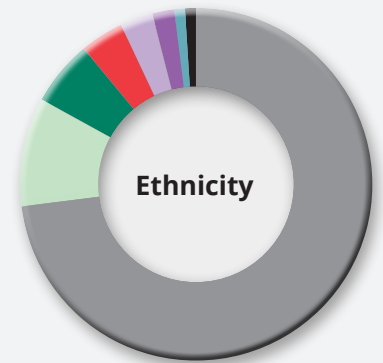
19% of recent Baltimore City public high school graduates attend Baltimore City Community College

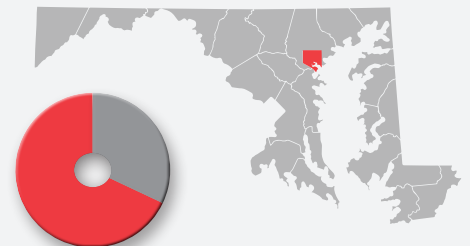
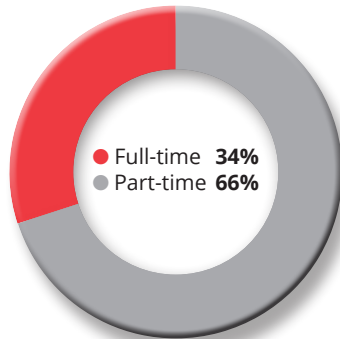

68% of BCCC's FY 2015 career and technical education concentrator program graduates were placed or retained in employment, or placed in military service or apprenticeship programs within six months of graduating from their program.

BCCC's Dental Hygiene graduates have achieved a 100% pass rate on the National Writing Board licensure exam for four consecutive years (FY 2014 - FY 2018).

FY 2018 marked the highest number of awards since FY 1984: 656 degrees and certificates were awarded to 586 graduates.

TUITION & FEES PER SEMESTER

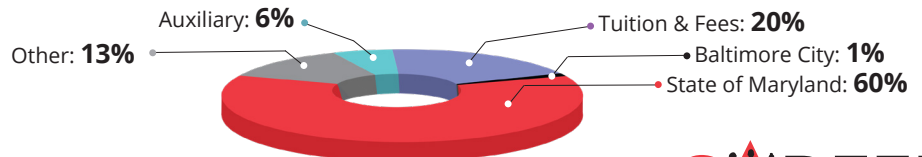
After 12 hours of payment of tuition and fees, in-state and out-of-state students will be allowed up to 6 hours with no additional cost in tuition and fees.
