WHO WE ARE

Founded in 1947, Baltimore City Community College (BCCC) is Maryland's only state-sponsored community college. In addition to the campus located at 2901 Liberty Heights Avenue, BCCC has multiple learning sites across the city offering career training, English language services, adult literacy and GED preparation courses. The Business and Continuing Education Division, located at 710 East Lombard Street, is where students receive training, certification, and licensure in areas such as cyber security, telecommunications, and pharmacy technician.

Students turn to BCCC for the affordable, accessible, quality programs they need for career preparation, technical or life skills training, and transfer to a four-year college or university. With personal attention and support of a distinguished, dedicated faculty, BCCC meets students where they are and guides them forward. Available are credit and noncredit offerings. Under the leadership of interim president **Dr. Carolyn Anderson**, BCCC serves as an active partner in local, state and federal efforts to address workforce needs in high-demand career fields.

DISTINGUISHED AND INNOVATIVE PROGRAMS

BCCC's topnotch **Nursing program** offers students the nurturing guidance of a highly experienced and respected faculty. For the last seven years (FY 2006 to FY 2013), 99 percent of those who took the Practical Nurse licensure exam passed.

BCCC is the only institution in Maryland to offer an associate's degree in **robotics technology**. The program received a \$1.5 million grant from the National Science Foundation to boost student participation, with a special focus on minorities.

Year Up is a national one-year, intensive training program that provides underserved young adults with a combination of hands-on skill development, college credits and corporate internships. The Year Up partnership with BCCC has produced a first-ever campus-based program, now a model for other community colleges.

The **Life Sciences Institute (LSI)** at the University of Maryland Biopark is home to the College's Biotechnology program. At this state-of-the-art facility, BCCC students learn in close proximity to top-notch university and private industry researchers and gain both academic and 'real-world' work experience. LSI students have been placed in paid internships and full-time jobs.

The BCCC **Upward Bound** Math and Science program, with a 5-year, \$1.25 million grant from the U.S. Department of Education, is strengthening the math and science skills of students from nearby high schools. The innovative program advances a U.S. Presidential mandate to qualify urban and minority students to pursue postsecondary degrees and careers in the promising fields of science, technology, engineering and math (STEM).
