- Presentations should be approximately 20 minutes – followed by a 10 minute question/answer session, and presented **FREE**.
- The Speakers Bureau will be available to all types of organizations, including civic, professional, faith-based, business, social, and others.
- BCCC speaking engagements shall typically be provided for evening requests; however, special consideration shall be given for daytime requests.
- BCCC Speakers **shall not** promote their personal entrepreneurial ventures.
